A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, <u>Burnham Football Club</u> is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

CUP COMPETITION HISTORY

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

History of North Greenford United FC

The club was founded in September 1944 as a youth team with a senior side formed the following year. In 2002, following the installation of floodlights, the club was elected to the Combined Counties League.

In 2003/04, managed by Steve Hawkins, the club were runners-up in the Premier Challenge Cup losing 4-1 to AFC Wimbledon. In 2004/05 they finished league runners-up and in 2006/07, under Mick Harvey, reached the Challenge Cup final again, this time losing 4-1 to Merstham. Steve Ringrose took over the Manager's job in 2008/09 achieving runners-up spot for the second time. Under Ringrose season 2009/10 was the most successful in the club's history when we were crowned CCL Champions, earning promotion to the Southern League Division One Central, and also winning the MFA Senior Charity Cup.

Despite having a difficult first season at the higher level the First Team succeeded in retaining its Step 4 status. However, the team struggled during the first half of season 2011/12 and Ringrose was replaced by Neil Shipperley who steered the side away from the threat of relegation. Experiencing an even more difficult time at the start of season 2012/13, Shipperley was re-appointed. An amazing end-of-season run saw the team finish just above the relegation places. Shipps resigned midway through the following season, replaced by Paul Palmer supported by Don Bennett.

Following another indifferent start to the 2014/15 campaign, Bennett took over from Palmer, but he too resigned in December when results did not improve. Reserve Manager Barry Morris took over and another impressive end-of-season run saw the team finish above AFC Hayes, and we were granted a reprieve by the FA. In September Morris resigned, initially replaced by George Bouhet and then by two ex-Blues – Ricky Pither and Danny Bennell. However, results did not improve, and we finished bottom of the table. This time there was to be no reprieve. After successfully appealing a proposed move to the Hellenic League we were returned to the CCL Premier Division.

Our return to Step 5 football in 2016/17 began very badly and a decision was taken in October to appoint the experienced management team of Danny Vincent and Colin Murphy, the club ending the season in a promising 13th position. We were hoping for further improvements in 2017/18 but, despite ending the campaign on a high with four wins on the spin, the team again finished 13th but with fewer points than the previous year. Vincent and Murphy then unexpectedly resigned just before the club was transferred to the Spartan League. The committee re-appointed Paul Palmer and Matt Penfold who had just won promotion with Southall. Hopes for a successful season were short-lived, however, as the club became embroiled in another relegation struggle. Following two successful seasons leading the Under 18's, the decision was taken to appoint Colin Jones and his management team, with Dino Pashias taking over as Youth Team manager. Much progress was made with regards player development, and in 2020/21 the team reached the FA Vase 3rd Round Proper for the first time.

Colin Jones resigned in April 2021 and the decision was taken to appoint his assistants, Paul Mills and Gary Brown. Paul and Gary agreed to share the responsibilities of the post and in May 2021 the club again found itself back in the CCL, in the newly formed Premier Division North. As it happened the 5th place finish in season 2021/22 was the highest the club had reached since being crowned CCL champions back in 2010. Cup success accompanied league success the following season. We reached the FA Cup First Qualifying Round, the Quarter-final of the MFA Senior Cup and, most successfully, the Third Round Proper of the FA Vase for a second time as well as the Final of the CCL Premier Challenge Cup. During both our last two seasons appalling weather conditions caused many postponements with the team having to play over a quarter of its league games in April – 10 in 2023 and 12 in 2024. Despite this, Paul and Gary still managed to finish both campaigns in a very creditable 8th position. Ending last season having to complete 12 fixtures in April effectively killed off any chances we had of reaching the play-offs. The season, however, will be most remembered for making club history in cup competitions. For the first time we progressed to the semi-final of the MFA Senior Challenge Cup and, for the second time, the final of the MFA Senior Charity Cup.

By far our greatest cup achievement though was progressing to the quarter-finals of the FA Vase. This wonderful run began with a 3-1 home win against Hollands & Blair in the 1st Round Proper. This was followed by an excellent all-round performance at Bedfont Sports in the 2nd Round to secure another 3-1 victory. We then won the 3rd Round tie away to West Sussex side Roffey in dramatic style scoring the winning goal in stoppage time.

Both the 4th and 5th Round ties – home to Brixham followed by an away trip to Tilbury – went to penalties with five perfect spot kicks on each occasion setting up the Quarter-final home contest against Romford. The narrow 1-0 defeat that day was obviously extremely disappointing for all involved but in no way did it detract from the magnificent achievement getting that far in the competition represented.



North Greenford United FC Player Profiles

JACOB BALLHEIMER (Goalkeeper): Signed for the Blues in July 2023, having previously played for Harefield United. A dependable keeper who has produced solid performances between the sticks.

RYAN EWHARE (Defender/Midfielder): Signed for the Blues in July 2023 from Hillingdon Borough. A versatile player with an eye for goal equally comfortable playing at full-back or wide midfield.

ANOTIDA MANO (Defender): Signed for the Blues in July 2023 from Harefield United. Has produced solid performances both at full-back and in the centre of the Blues defence.

GEORGIE BROWN (Defender): A talented defender who signed for the club in July 2019, making 35 appearances during the two Covid lockdown seasons. He has since made a huge contribution to the squad's development appearing over 120 times at the heart of the Blues defence.

JOE GRITT (Defender): Named as team captain for this season's campaign. An experienced defender who signed for NGU from Sheerwater in Nov 22, appearing 30 times and making significant contributions at the centre of the Blues defence. He started in 43 games last season, scoring 4 important goals.

JOE MILLS (Midfielder): Making over 160 appearances and scoring 52 goals in his central midfield role, Joe has made a massive contribution to the progress and achievements of the First Team since signing for the club back in July 2019. Deservedly named Managers' Player of the Year last season.

CHARLIE MITCHELL (Forward): An experienced forward who re-signed for the Blues in 2020 from Uxbridge after first playing for the club in 2015/16. Since then he has made 129 further appearances, scoring 56 goals, his most prolific period being during seasons 21/22 & 22/23.

SAM BROWN (Defender/Midfielder): Named as Managers' Player of the Year in 2022/23 reflecting his progress since being promoted to the First Team in 21/22. Established himself as a key member of the Blues midfield and in 23/24 continued to develop in that role, scoring 5 goals in his 47 appearances.

CHRIS MARTIN-THOMAS (Forward): Signed for NGU during the 2021/22 season from Spelthorne Sports making 32 appearances and scoring 10 goals. Made 20 further in 22/23 adding 8 more goals to his NGU tally. Has made an impressive start to this season's campaign scoring 7 goals in his 11 appearances.

HARVEY KILLEEN (Forward): Signed from Hanwell in 2021/22, he became NGU's top goal-scorer with 30 goals, bettering that with 31 the following season. He joined Ascot Utd in the summer but re-signed in Nov 2023. Has already notched up 6 goals this season, including a hat-trick against Milton United.

GEORGE HARMES (Midfielder): Has made an effective contribution to the Blues excellent start to this season's league campaign. He is a committed and aggressive player who has made 76 appearances and produced consistent performances in midfield after joining NGU from AFC Hayes in July 2022.

RYAN LEHANE (Goalkeeper): First played for the Blues in 2021/22 when he made 13 appearances. Re-signed for the club this season starting in 5 games and keeping a clear sheet against Broadfields United.

JOSHUA QUADRY (Defender): Signed for the Blues in July 2023, having previously played for Bedfont and British Airways. An important member of the squad who has performed well at full-back both when starting and appearing as a substitute.

HARRISON OKWU (Defender): A pacy defender who signed for NGU in 2021/22 from Spelthorne Sports making 26 appearances followed by a further 27 in 22/23. He re-signed for the Blues at the start of the current campaign appearing as a substitute in 5 games.

ELLIOTT BRYNE (Defender): Strong central defender who signed for the Blues in August 2022. Improved performances saw him start in 26 games last season as well as make 11 substitute appearances. An important squad member who has to date made 9 appearances this season, starting in 5 games.

JEREMIAH DEBAYO (Defender): An experienced defender who signed from Holyport at the start of the current campaign. He as made 6 appearances, including 1 start, since joining the club.

LUKE BALDWIN (Midfielder): Experienced midfielder signed from Harefield United in July 2023. An important squad member who has made 39 appearances including 12 starts since joining the club.

OLUWAJENYO BALOGUN (Midfielder): Signed from Burnham at the start of the current campaign. Has made 8 appearances and scored the match winning goal in the FA Cup replay against Corinthian Casuals.

TOMASZ SIEMIENCZUK (Forward): An experienced forward who signed for the Blues in July 2023, having previously played for Ashford Town and Hanwell. Has made 44 appearances for the club during which he scored 11 goals.

JEFFREY SEKYERE (Forward): Promising forward who signed for the club at the start of the current campaign. To date has made 3 substitute appearances scoring a goal against Wallingford & Crowmarsh.


