Welcome to The 1878 Stadium, Burnham Football Club

Hello and welcome to The 1878 Stadium for this Combined Counties Football League Premier Division North fixture between Burnham and our friends from [Wallingford & Crowmarsh FC](#).

Wallingford & Crowmarsh sit in 12th position in the league table on 21 points from 17 games. Throughout November they have come away with two draws and two defeats. Yet they remain in the Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup and face Milton at home next Tuesday evening. Let's give manager Lee Matthews and his squad a warm welcome this afternoon.

Burnham are just above today's visitors in 11th position, again on 21 points, however the blues have accumulated this from just 14 games. Our 7 game unbeaten run came to an end last weekend at Risborough Rangers (1-0). So the Bakali brothers and the rest of the Burnham team will be keen to return to winning ways with a top performance and another win again today.

We have introduced some new content to today's match day programme. There is plenty of useful information available for first time visitors plus some insight relating to our FIFA Certified 3G artificial pitch.

The bar will be open from 12 noon and this is where we show live matches from Sky Sports and TNT Sports on TV, as well as live league match updates from Football Web Pages on another screen. Our turnstiles typically open about 45 minutes before kick-off and as usual our pitch side snack bar M&Ms is serving a wide selection of hot and cold food and refreshments throughout today's match.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, Burnham Football Club is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

CUP COMPETITION HISTORY

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

History of Wallingford & Crowmarsh FC

Wallingford's football history dates back to at least 1889. A report in the Oxford Journal of 27th April 1889 shows "a match was played in the Croft on Easter Monday between the Wallingford Football Club and the Queen's Park Rangers, London, resulting in a draw, two goals each". A Wallingford side competed in the inaugural season of the North Berks Football League in 1909-10 but Wallingford Town Football Club was not formed until 1922. The newly formed Wallingford Town won the North Berks War Memorial Cup in 1922 and 1923 and the Charity Shield in 1929. Having finished as North Berks Division 1 runners-up in 1923-24, the club switched to the Reading & District League and were crowned Premier Division winners in 1935-36. We were founder members of the Hellenic League in 1953 became Hellenic League Premier Division champions in 1968-69 League Cup runners-up in 1982-83. After 36 consecutive seasons, our Hellenic premier division status was lost in 1989.

A short spell in Hellenic League Division One followed before a switch to the Chiltonian League. In 1995, AFC Wallingford was formed by the merger of Town and Wallingford United, then members of the Chiltonian League and themselves seven-time winners of the North Berks War Memorial Cup. AFC Wallingford spent 3 seasons in the Chiltonian League, winning the 1995-96 League Cup final against Denham & the League title in 1997-98. Carl Henry was the goal-scoring sensation that season, setting a club record with 62 goals. With the championship came promotion to the Combined Counties League.

Progress continued under manager Dave Crowdy and in 2000-01 he led 'Wally' to runners-up positions in the Combined Counties League and Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy. Season 2001-02 saw the club go one better, winning the Combined Counties Championship and the Berks and Bucks Senior Trophy, beating Milton Keynes City 3-2 in a thrilling final. Striker Andy Shildrick won the Combined Counties Golden Boot award for the top goal scorer in 2002-03, as we were pipped to the league title firstly by Withead and then by AFC Wimbledon. The summer of 2004 saw major upheavals and 2004-05 turned into an unsuccessful struggle against relegation. We bounced back at the first time of asking but it was a brief upturn in fortunes. Having been transferred back to the Hellenic Premier in 2006, relegation to Division 1 followed. The financial strain of remaining at step 6 of the national pyramid began to take its toll. A rapid decline in fortunes followed. In 2008 the club decided to step back to local football returning to the North Berks League after an 84-year absence.

In 2013 we reverted back to Wallingford Town FC, and switched back to the original 1922 colours of red and white stripes. The club applied to return to the nonleague pyramid in the 2017/18 season with then Chairman Simon Cowlard and 1st Team manager Duncan Mitchell attending a meeting at Wembley Stadium with The FA to put a case forward for resubmission. The move-up was granted and after 4 seasons in the Hellenic League East, the club moved back to the Combined Counties League after The FA performed a re-structure of Step 5 & 6 leagues. In the summer of 2021/22 season and with the club's committee weakened by the resignations of several key members, former manager Glenn Goudie, who managed the 1st team for three seasons, stepped into the Chairman's role and his first task was to appoint former Ardley United manager Lee Matthews as 1st team manager. Matthews and his squad gelled quickly and were unbeaten after 17 league games. A club record of games without defeat. After a nervy January, the side began to hit form at the key stages of the season, and promotion was gained via the playoffs, beating Hilltop 2-1 AET.

At the beginning of the 2022/23 season, the club became Wallingford & Crowmarsh FC after an amalgamation between Wallingford Town and Crowmarsh Youth in an effort to boost community involvement and improve player pathways. The club now boasts 35 teams from U6 to adults male and female teams. Lee Matthews enters his fourth season with the club and is looking to push the team to make positive progress each season.

The club is very grateful to all our sponsorship partners and the club is determined to become stronger over the next few seasons.

Match Days at The 1878 Stadium, Burnham Football Club

We welcome visitors to the 1878 Stadium on a regular basis. For some it's a frequent return and for others it's their first time to the ground. The following information provides some useful guidance with links for more information.

The 1878 Stadium

Maximum capacity 2,500 including covered seating for 300 in the main stand. There is also a small covered section on the far side of the pitch with standing room only. Supporters can watch from the concrete path behind the fencing which surrounds the artificial 3G surface. Supporters are not allowed on the pitch and pitch invasions are not permitted.

Parking

There are approximately 100 free parking spaces at the 1878 Stadium. However, with players and management attending you may be required to park off site. If you do then please be park sensibly, keep traffic flowing and allow driveway access.

Parking is offered on a first come first served basis. Fines have been issued by the Police for parking illegally on the roads outside the stadium. It takes approx 10-15 minutes to walk to the 1878 Stadium from Burnham Village High Street. Therefore, please park sensibly, walk or car share if possible.

Please DO NOT park in spaces reserved for Burnham FC Management or in front of the double gates which lead onto the pitch. These gates are to allow access for the emergency services during training and on match days.

There is also [wheelchair access](#) to the ground, with access to toilets both inside the [Blues Bar and Cafe](#) and within the Stadium itself.

The Blues Bar and Cafe

Live matches on Sky and TNT (BT Sport) are available to watch while you relax and enjoy the club's main bar and social space. Alcoholic drinks and soft drinks are available, cash and card payments accepted. [The Blues Bar and Cafe](#) is also available for hire, please use the form provided if you would like to learn more and check availability.

Admission

Refreshments and Food

Teas, coffees, soft drinks and alcoholic beverages can be purchased before and during the game from the Stadium Cafe hatch just inside the turnstiles. You can also purchase confectionery and hot food there too – Cash and card payments are accepted. *Only drinks purchased from the premises can be consumed on the premises – Plastic containers only within the stadium.*

If you arrive early, for whatever reason, no problem. You can wait in the Blues Bar or in the outside seating area until your allocated start time. We also ask you to allow enough time before your paid session ends for the hand over.

Pitch dimensions

115 yards by 75 yards. The distance of pitch from the dressing rooms is 5 meters.

Important information for players, managers and spectators

For the benefit of the players

We want people to enjoy their time at The 1878 Stadium. If for any reason you forget to bring your boots or Astros, there is a selection of boots in various sizes you can borrow while you are here. Just ask a staff member at pitch side hatch for help.

Sitting or laying on the pitch (unless genuinely injured), wearing flat shoes, trainers, sliders, socks or bear feet has the effect of ironing the grass fibres. Flattening the surface damages the complex water drainage system, causing waterlogging and dramatically reducing the life expectancy of the artificial pitch. Socks only, bear feet, shoes, trainers or sliders with flat soles are NOT permitted – No Excuses! Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated. If you want to learn why, [click here](#)
