Hello and welcome to The 1878 Stadium for this Combined Counties Football League fixture between Burnham and our friends from Wokingham Town FC for this last home game of the 2024/25 league season. Also, we have great pleasure in welcoming back today's match day mascots – The Burnham Junior U11 Blues!

Wokingham Town currently sit in 16th position in the league table with 34 points from 31 games. Burnham now sit in 5th position following back to back wins against Milton United and Virginia Water, with 53 points from 32 games. Head2Head in our last 3 fixtures: 15/04/24 Burnham 4-0 Wokingham Town, 27/04/24 Wokingham Town 3-2 Burnham, 18/01/25 Wokingham Town 0-2 Burnham. Today will be a close, competitive encounter for sure.

If this is your first visit, there is plenty of free parking available within the ground if everyone parks sensibly and close enough to the next vehicle. Please be careful not to restrict the flow of traffic or block driveways if you do park outside the ground and always keep valuables safely out of sight, on your person or better still leave them at home.

If you arrive early for today's game you can wait in The Blues Bar from 12:30, visiting teams will have access to the changing rooms when our first team management arrive and as usual we will open our turnstiles approx. 45 minutes before kick-off. Just so you are aware, it is cash only at our turnstiles, cash and cards are accepted everywhere else within the ground.

Our pitch side snack bar, M&Ms, is open for supporters and there's a wide selection of hot and cold food and refreshments on sale including burgers, hotdogs, chicken burgers, bacon rolls and cheesy chips, plus a great selection of beers, barista coffees, hot chocolate and even Bovril.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, Burnham Football Club is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

CUP COMPETITION HISTORY

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

Match Days at The 1878 Stadium, Burnham Football Club

We welcome visitors to the 1878 Stadium on a regular basis. For some it's a frequent return and for others it's their first time to the ground. The following information provides some useful guidance with links for more information.

The 1878 Stadium

Maximum capacity 2,500 including covered seating for 300 in the main stand. There is also a small covered section on the far side of the pitch with standing room only. Supporters can watch from the concrete path behind the fencing which surrounds the artificial 3G surface. Supporters are not allowed on the pitch and pitch invasions are not permitted.

Travel

Parking

There are approximately 100 free parking spaces at the 1878 Stadium. However, with players and management attending you may be required to park off site. If you do then please be park sensibly, keep traffic flowing and allow driveway access. Parking is offered on a first come first served basis. It takes approx 10-15 minutes to walk to the 1878 Stadium from Burnham Village High Street. Therefore, please park sensibly, walk or car share if possible.

Please DO NOT park in spaces reserved for Burnham FC Management or in front of the double gates which lead onto the pitch. These gates are to allow access for the emergency services during training and on match days. There is also [wheelchair access](#) to the ground, with access to toilets both inside the [Blues Bar and Cafe](#) and within the Stadium itself.

The Blues Bar and Cafe

Live matches on Sky and TNT (BT Sport) are available to watch while you relax and enjoy the club's main bar and social space. Alcoholic drinks and soft drinks are available, cash and card payments accepted. [The Blues Bar and Cafe](#) is also available for hire, please use the form provided if you would like to learn more and check availability.

Admission

Please check our [social profiles](#) prior to match days. Admission prices differ depending on who is playing and whether it is a league or cup fixture. As an example, admission prices for all Burnham FC LEAGUE MATCHES are as follows:

UNDER 16S – FREE ADMISSION

PLEASE NOTE - ONLY CASH IS ACCEPTED AT THE TURNSTILES. Both cash and cards are accepted in the main bar and pitch side snack bar.

Refreshments and Food

Teas, coffees, soft drinks and alcoholic beverages can be purchased before and during the game from the Stadium Cafe hatch just inside the turnstiles. You can also purchase confectionery and hot food there too – Cash and card payments are accepted. *Only drinks purchased from the premises can be consumed on the premises – Plastic containers only within the stadium.*

Please be aware:

- Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated.
- Dogs are allowed in the stadium, however, they must be kept on a lead at all times.
- No flares or fireworks allowed.

History of Wokingham Town FC

Although a new name for many, this season marks the 150th season since Wokingham Town Football Club was formed, making it the fourth oldest club in Berkshire. Notable achievements for WTFC during the last century include the purchase of the Finchampstead Road enclosure in 1928, entering senior football in 1953, reaching the quarter-finals of the FA Amateur Cup in 1958 in which a record 10,000 crowd saw WTFC lose 3-2 at Crook Town, gaining promotion to the Isthmian League Premier Division and reaching the First Round Proper of the FA Cup in 1982, and reaching the semi-final of the FA Trophy in 1988. After selling its Finchampstead Road ground, the club led a nomadic existence until 2004 when WTFC (originally founded in 1875) returned to the town forming a merger with Emmbrook Sports (founded in 1989) to create Wokingham & Emmbrook FC. The merger 'bedded-in' under the guidance of Glenn Duggleby and Dave Evans and the club finished 11th in the Hellenic League Division 1 East. In 2005/06 the club achieved its highest ever placing, finishing 3rd under the experienced guidance of Tony Calvert, as player-manager. Season 2006/07 started with the managerial partnership of Jez Lynch and Danny Humphries under chairman Kearon Brown.

Despite their best efforts all three soon left the club and in November 2007 Wayne Wanklyn, a former professional player with Reading, was appointed as manager with Roger Herridge his assistant & Sam Page his coach. During his tenure Wayne secured promotion to the Hellenic Premier Division and won the Reading Challenge Cup at the Madjeski Stadium. He stepped down in 2010 and the club promoted Roger Herridge to the post with Dan Bateman as his assistant. Season 2011/12 saw the Sumas play their first games in the FA Cup for over ten years, finish 10th in the league and win the Reading Challenge Cup again.

The following season they went one better, retaining the Reading Senior Cup and finishing 8th in the league. In 2013/14 the club returned to Lowther Road as well as dropping back to Division 1 East. Dan Bateman and Matt Eggleston took over as joint-managers and helped the Sumas climb the table to finish in runners-up spot. The club also retained the Reading Senior Cup for the third season running. Under Bateman and Eggleston 2014/15 turned out to be one of the club's most successful seasons. The Sumas won promotion back to the Hellenic Premier Division as League Champions, again retained the Reading Senior Cup and were runners-up in the County Cup. Ground requirements then forced the club into a ground share arrangement with Henley Town, and in 2015/16 the demands of ground sharing took its toll as the team struggled to retain their league position and were eventually relegated. 2016/17 saw Clive McNelly take over as First team manager. Unfortunately, playing out of Lowther Road, the season did not pan out as expected with player changes leaving the Sumas near the bottom of the table.

The following season the thriving youth section took over the running of the senior teams with Steve Williams taking over as Club Chairman, Bob Good as Club Secretary and a new committee involved in every aspect of running the club. The new committee re-appointed Dan Bateman as 1st team manager and the 2018/2019 season saw him look to youth, introducing several U17s players into the First Team. Whilst there was no silverware, the team finished 6th and, more importantly, the foundations were laid for the future. In addition to youth, there was also the welcome return of Matt Eggleston to First Team management with Jamie Shepherd and Ben Winship as coaches. In 2019/2020, following the Local Council's approval of the planning application in July 2018, the Club were delighted to be able to return to Wokingham with new facilities at Lowther Road that included floodlights, a 100 seater stand and associated works.

After a somewhat nomadic existence in recent years we have now re-established senior football back in Wokingham commencing the 2019/20 season at Lowther Road Emmbrook almost 20 years since Wokingham Town moved from their Finchampstead Road Ground in 1999. That season also saw the reintroduction of an Allied Counties U18 team. Despite an extremely promising campaign, with the team pushing for a 3rd place finish, the season was unfortunately curtailed by the Covid-19 pandemic. The same happened in 2020/21, a season that had also started with some great performances and excellent results. However, on this occasion, with the team unbeaten and sitting at the top of the Hellenic East Division One table, the club earned promotion to Step 5 based on their results during this and the previous season. Within the newly reorganised FA structure, the club were then placed in the Combined Counties Premier Division North. The club looked forward to this new challenge, albeit sadly seeking new management after Dan Bateman and Matt Eggleston stepped down during the summer. Their contribution had been immeasurable, but we were pleased when they agreed to stay involved with the club. Last season was a momentous one for the club, which sat bottom of the league with 12 games remaining.

However, under the new management of Darren Purbrick & Matt Eggleston, the team won six of its final 10 games during the month of April to eventually secure a respectable 15th position. The club is currently in a strong mid-table position in 11th place having won 9 and drawn 2 of their 23 league games played so far.

The club now boasts players from more than 62 teams representing Wokingham Town from the age of 7, including thriving girls & women's teams, an U18 Allied Counties team, Reserves and an over50s walking football team.

Jamie Mitchell's 100th appearance for the blues

Defender Jamie Mitchell made his 100th appearance against Milton United recently. Coming on in the second half of the game he immediately made an impact with Burnham eventual 3-1 winners.

Originally from Dundonald Northern Ireland he came to Burnham FC from Holmer Green and made his debut in a 1-1 FA Cup draw against Easington Sports on 06/08/22.

Jamie likes to attack down the left and he is quick to get back into position when defending. Jamie's wife and their young daughter cheered from the sidelines along with other members of the family.

Everyone at the club is very proud of Jamie's achievement and we value his hard work ethic and commitment to Burnham Football Club over the last 3 seasons. A follower of the Christian faith, after the game he thanked God for being blessed. Moving up into 6th position in the Combined Counties Football League Premier Division North Burnham now face Virginia Water away at Arbour Park on Tuesday night, returning to The 1878 Stadium for our last home game of the season against Wokingham Town on Saturday 15th March.

Pitch dimensions

115 yards by 75 yards. The distance of pitch from the dressing rooms is 5 meters.

Important information for players, managers and spectators

We have VERY strict rules regarding permitted footwear when anyone enters the pitch enclosure. Rules that apply to players, those in the dugouts and supporters who, for example, want to take photos. Please read – [Permitted Footwear at The 1878 Stadium, Burnham Football Club](#)

For the benefit of the players

We want people to enjoy their time at The 1878 Stadium. If for any reason you forget to bring your boots or Astros, there is a selection of boots in various sizes you can borrow while you are here. Just ask a staff member at pitch side hatch for help.

Sitting or laying on the pitch (unless genuinely injured), wearing flat shoes, trainers, sliders, socks or bear feet has the effect of ironing the grass fibres. Flattening the surface damages the complex water drainage system, causing waterlogging and dramatically reducing the life expectancy of the artificial pitch. Socks only, bear feet, shoes, trainers or sliders with flat soles are NOT permitted – No Excuses! Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated. If you want to learn why, [click here](#)

- All teams are asked to share permitted footwear guidance prior to match day.
- There are signs strategically positioned explaining the rules.
- Our pitch, our rules – Ignorance is no excuse.
